Operational Definition: What is a Patient-Centered Medical Home?

- First developed by American Academy of Pediatrics as a model of delivering primary care that is accessible, continuous, comprehensive, family-centered, compassionate, and culturally effective care (AAP)
- Trend currently includes expanding reach of care for adults to create a more effective and efficient model of health care delivery
- A patient-centered medical home is an approach to providing comprehensive primary care for people of all ages and medical conditions. It is a way for a physician-led medical practice, chosen by the patient, to integrate health care services for that patient who confronts a complex and confusing health care system. (AAFP)
- While PCMH has many definitions, the current emerging consensus definition is reflected in 7 Joint Principles

Joint Principles: PCMH Concept

- Issued “Joint Principles of the Patient-Centered Medical Home” March 2007
- Adopted by four specialty societies---
American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP);
American College of Physicians (ACP);
American Academy of Family Physicians (AAFP); and American Osteopathic Association (AOA)

7 Joint Principles

- Personal physician
- Physician directed medical practice
- Whole person orientation
- Care is coordinated and/or integrated
- Quality and safety
- Enhanced access
- Payment
